EXPERT WITNESS FEES

- An expert witness, professional witness, or judicial expert is a witness who by virtue of education, training, skill or experience is believed to have expertise and specialized knowledge in a particular subject beyond that of the average person, sufficient that others may officially and legally rely upon their specialized opinion regarding evidence or fact issues within the scope of their expertise,
- × 92.231 Expert witnesses; fee.
 - + (1) The term "expert witness" as used herein shall apply to any witness who offers himself or herself in the trial of any action as an expert witness or who is subpoenaed to testify in such capacity before a state attorney in the investigation of a criminal matter, or before a grand jury, and who is permitted by the court to qualify and testify as such, upon any matter pending before any court.
 - + (2) Any expert or skilled witness who shall have testified in any cause shall be allowed a witness fee including the cost of any exhibits used by such witness in an amount agreed to by the parties, and the same shall be taxed as costs. In instances where services are provided for the state, including for state-paid private court-appointed counsel, payment from state funds shall be in accordance with standards adopted by the Legislature.

EXPERT WITNESS FEES (CONTINUED)

- Expert Witness fees include costs paid for experts in the following fields:
 - + Investigative
 - + General Expert
 - + Psychological Exams
 - + Psychologists
 - + Medical Doctors
 - + Accounting
 - + Toxicology
 - + DNA Experts
 - + Adult Competency/Mental Disabilities

EXPERT WITNESS FEES (CONTINUED)

- × Where do we get them:
 - + Court Administration: Court Administration has a limited number of Expert Witness Contracts for criminal cases.
 - + SAO Contracts: Agencies can establish Contracts or Memos of Understanding (MOU's) with experts that are utilized on a consistent basis.

 - + We have Indigent Service Committee (ISC)
 Rates that were established to set limits on rates.

Investigators	not to exceed \$100/hour
General Expert	\$200/hour
Psychologist-Exam	\$300/Exam
Psychologist (out of court)	\$200/hour
Psychologist (in court/depo)	\$200/hour
Medical Doctor (out of court)	not to exceed \$300/hour
Medical Doctor (in Court/depo)	not to exceed \$400/hour
